WHAT DOES A PARISH COUNCIL DO?


Parish Councils are local authorities first created by statute in 1894. Parliament has given parish councils the power to raise and spend money – a power shared by other local authorities. The parish council is the tier of local government closest to the people. Each parish council is made up of individual councillors – in the case of Ulceby 11 parish councillors – who contribute to the work of the whole council by suggesting ideas, engaging in constructive debate, responding to the needs and views of the community, behaving in an ethical way and being open about interests, commenting on proposals to ensure the best outcome and voting – to enable the council to make decisions. The Chairman, assisted by the clerk, guides these activities by managing the meeting of the council.

The Parish Council is responsible for the services it provides. It establishes policies for action and decides how money will be raised and spent on behalf of the community. It is responsible for spending public money lawfully and without risk and for achieving the best value for money. See page 19 to find out how the money was spent last year.

The Parish Council represents and serves the whole community. Most communities are made up of many smaller communities, often with different interests, a council's duty is to serve them all. The council balances the needs of different elements of the community to get the best result. Frequently it has the difficult task of deciding what the best result might be.

The Chairman of the parish council and the clerk, in partnership, guide the council to ensure that effective and lawful decisions are taken at meetings. A good and effective parish council work as a team whose common aim is to serve the community.




WHERE DOES YOUR MONEY GO?

Of the amount each household pays to North Lincolnshire Council in Council Tax, approximately £20 is passed to Ulceby Parish Council in the precept. A proportion of this is spent on essential items, and the remainder is spent locally to benefit the village, as the Parish Council thinks fit. Some is used to improve the appearance of the village, such as flower displays and grass cutting around the church and playing field, and some to support local groups and organisations. If you are involved in such a group which is in need of funding, or are interested in setting up a new group and would like to apply for some financial assistance, there is an application form available from the website www.ulceby.net, or from Karen Pickering, the clerk to the council.

The precept maintained at £12,500 for 2014/15, as it had been for a number of years, and still is for the current year 2015/16. In addition, some income is received from the cost of advertising in this newsletter, which more than covers the cost of its printing. For your information, the chart below gives a breakdown of how the precept was spent in 2014/15. A large proportion of the village maintenance was spent on the new village signs, as the old wooden signs were rotting, and it was felt that it was worth investing in metal signs which should welcome people to the village for many years to come.
