

PARISH COUNCIL AUTUMN UPDATE

The August and September meetings of the Parish Council were dominated with discussions about the flooding difficulties experienced in the village over recent years. At the August meeting, Mr Rod Chapman and his colleague, Mr Alan Drury from North Lincolnshire Council, listened to the many village voices who raised their concerns over the fact that, seven years after the worst flooding which Ulceby had known, no apparent steps had been taken to improve the situation. Mr Chapman was aware of the problems we had experienced and was taking action to improve the drainage position.

North Lincolnshire Council have scheduled work to renew the drainage system along Coronation Road and at the junction of Spruce Lane to take place before the end of the financial year 2017/18. This new system would also benefit the properties at the top of Front Street. Mr Chapman listened carefully to many personal accounts of flood experience and agreed that, prior to the planned drainage renewal, several houses particularly specified by residents would be visited by himself and Mr Drury immediately following this meeting, to try to find ways to minimise further problems. Mr Chapman also apologised for the absence of Mr Matthew Moore of Anglian Water who had promised to attend, and advised the meeting that he would make every endeavor to ensure Mr Moore's attendance at the September meeting.

At the September meeting, Messrs Chapman and Drury again attended and reported on the actions and drain clearance which had taken place as promised, and explained various other schemes which were being progressed to ease possible further drainage problems prior to the planned drain replacement.

Mr Moore of Anglian Water then addressed the meeting with regard to the foul water/sewage problems experienced, mainly, in Abbey Road. He explained that the boundary in which Anglian Water operated stretched from the Humber to London and the whole area and its' flood issues came under this umbrella. There may be some action taken by Anglian Water in the Abbey Road area towards the end of 2020 but, because of the size of the huge area covered by this Water Authority, if a greater need was deemed to be discovered elsewhere, then, regrettably, that problem would be given priority. Mr Moore stressed the importance of affected residents needing to ring the Anglian Water Authority ON EVERY OCCASION THAT FLOODING OCCURRED and request a form DD5 to complete and return to register the property. In so doing, the need for improvement in Ulceby would be increased. In other words, the more we complain, the more our needs and problems will be registered with the Water Authority, and this will move our village further towards the front of the queue for action!!

The Parish Council were not able to obtain a solid time commitment from Mr Moore and we would therefore take this opportunity to urge residents, once again, that if you experience sewage/foul water flooding problems, it is essential that you register this fact by telephoning Anglian Water immediately.



Village Hall Updates

Toilet refurbishment - as regular hall users will know, the Village Hall toilets have received a major refit. Gone are the institutional blue and pink walls - instead the walls have been lined with a marble effect pvc cladding. There are new toilet suites and doors to the cubicles, new non slip easy clean flooring and urinal in the gents. The old hand basins and worktops have been replaced with stainless steel hand basins and push button taps. Both ladies and gents now have hot water supplied by instantaneous water heaters which only heat water when the tap is turned on. The ladies will be pleased that a fan heater has been fitted, energised by a timer switch, which should take the chill off the air. There are now baby-changing facilities in the disabled toilet. As well as making them more attractive for users, they are now more environmentally friendly.

Thanks are given to Shirley Hulatt for securing the funding from WREN and North Lincolnshire Council Community Fund for this latest improvement.
