

Chairman's Update May to July 2017

Before the May meeting proper began, the Annual Parish Assembly took place. Basically, this meeting is always held before the May meeting each year when one of the Councillors is appointed Chairman and various donations to organisations and charities, discussed the previous March, are finally agreed. Arrangements are in hand for a new dog litter bin to be sited at the area of the village pump in Coronation Road, and the large pothole at the corner of West End is taking longer to repair because the current road works at the new Co-op store are taking place immediately before the necessary road repairs to the pothole and are delaying any repair work.

The Clerk is pursuing further information with North Lincs Council on the road closure at the Memorial on Remembrance Sunday and Councillor Bell has agreed to become the local contact in place of Mr P Sandberg who has held the post for many years. After discussion, it was agreed that action would be taken to improve the overall appearance of the War Memorial with the Clerk enquiring about a grant which may be available for this work. At the July meeting the cost of a new flagpole, rope and two new flags were discussed and when further costs were ascertained, hopefully by the next meeting, a decision on renewing the same will be made. In short, it is hoped that all the improvements will be in place before Remembrance Sunday and that the Annual Remembrance Service will take place in November as normal.

Consultations on an extension of double yellow lines in Front Street closed in April and because one resident had objected, this matter has again been referred for discussion at NLC. In order to reduce speeding, the 30 mph limit on Brocklesby Road will be extended approximately 200 yards towards the bridge over the motorway and, beyond that, at the boundary of North Lincolnshire, when entering the village, a new 50 mph limit will be established.





Drivers parking their vehicles on the pavement

Can drivers who park on the pavement bear in mind that they are making life for wheelchair and pushchair users difficult. Users of mobility scooters, and mothers with pushchairs and young children are forced to travel on the road.

Vehicles that park on the pavement also cause damage to the surface, which has to be repaired and the tax payer inevitably foots the bill. So please, have a little consideration for others.

Drivers who own a driveway but don't use them

Although the majority of villagers are sensible when it comes to parking, the small minority don't seem to care. This is very sad and upsetting. Consideration towards others goes a long way! If driveway owners keep their vehicles on their drive, rather than parking on the highway, more parking space is available for others.

There is a First Responder who lives in the village, and often has to park some distance away from his house. As a First Responder, he needs to be close to his car, so in the event of an emergency, he can get in his vehicle and go!

Also on occasions Blue Badge holders are forced to walk quite a distance from their car to their home. This seems unfair as they have blue badges for a reason.

Please can people stop and think when parking – "Do I really need to park here? Or should I go a few feet further and leave room for someone who really needs the space?" **Not all disabilities are visible**, though it doesn't mean they don't need a Blue Badge!

A little kindness costs nothing, but means so much.

Disability affects ALL ages, does not discriminate, and is not nice! Some people think that the Blue Badge Scheme is available to the majority. This is simply not true!! The qualifying criteria for the Blue Badge Scheme is VERY strict,

and contrary to belief, they aren't given away like sweeties.

If you don't need a Blue Badge, consider yourself lucky!!



DOOR-TO-DOOR SALES VISITORS

Some residents have reported unwanted visitors at their door. There may be more in the future so there are some simple signs to look for:

- They may say they are on community service, or recently out of prison or on work release

This is unlikely to be true, and often used as an opening gambit to shock or worry you.

- They may present you with a laminated card

Does the card they gave you look official? A laminated card with a photo is not official identification. Do not trust something that seems home-made.

- They may be wearing no uniform

If they say there are there on behalf of a utility company (like your gas, electric or phone) then they should be wearing a uniform.

If you have any reason to suspect the person is not genuine then close the door with a firm "no thank you". You may also wish to report the incident to the non-emergency police number, just dial 101 from your phone.

TELEPHONE SCAMS

If you receive a call from people saying they are from BT, or Microsoft or any other official company and they then ask you to provide any account information or ask you to do anything with your computer - hang up the phone. These scam callers often call from abroad, and there is little that UK authorities can be done to stop them. Don't waste any of your time dealing with them. If you receive these nuisance calls regularly speak to your phone provider about caller ID or call blocking.

FRIENDS OF ST NICHOLAS CHURCH Church Restoration Update – July 2017



Whilst there is no visible work going on in and around the Church it has been a very busy period with structural surveys of the tower and roof being carried out and reports written with regard to the condition of the church.

All work on the church has to have the approval of the Lincoln Diocese and Historic England and we are pleased to say that the roof repair modifications have been agreed by the Diocese but we are waiting for the approval of Historic England. Once these approvals are to hand, tendering for the work can begin. We hope to see work physically start to repair the roof in early 2018.

There was a £15,000 shortfall in the grant offered by the Heritage Lottery Fund for the roof repairs which we needed to make up from other sources. We were fortunate to be granted £8,000 from the National Churches Trust to help fill this gap. Further grants are currently being applied for to fill the remainder of the shortfall.

In addition to the Roof Repairs, the renovation project also includes installing a toilet and kitchen area and creating a useable community space. This will cost in excess of £38,000 which again is hoped to be funded largely with grants, but our recent fundraising will further support the shortfall. We then will have to repeat the roof repair project with a project to make urgent repairs to the tower. Thank you for your on-going support.
