2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST ON THE AGENDA ITEMS

3. ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES OF THE MONTHLY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 18th FEBRUARY 2019.

IT WAS RESOLVED that the minutes of the parish council meetings held on 18th February 2019 be confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

4. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 18th FEBRUARY 2019.

- i) Manor House building works the owner of this property sent through an explanation for the demolition of the wood store and advised that the store would be rebuilt with the reclaimed bricks.
- ii) Bus service Cllr Hannigan advised the meeting that the transport team at N.L.C are reviewing all rural bus services with a view to creating an efficient network. The current 450 bus service is to remain as it is at present for the foreseeable future. The callconnect service is to undergo some changes in that it will no longer run in conjunction with Lincolnshire. Callconnect will still take the bookings for journeys but the actual service is likely to be called a different name. N.L.C are trying to put in fixed routes for this new 'callconnect' service to make this transport system more efficient and effective.

It was noted that flowers/planting was over budget but the overspend in this category is mainly offset by the two grants of £1000 and £450.

A small overspend is noted in the village seats category as a new seat was purchased to service residents walking to the village shop.

The village general fund is also overspent due to the need to purchase new dog bins and a green salt bin to service the village shop area.

iii) To give consideration to the purchase of a green parish salt bin to be situated at Friarsgate – on the bank - £250.00 +vat.

IT WAS RESOLVED unanimously to purchase a salt bin for this location.

- New Police matters It was noted that thefts have been taking place from gardens and a white transit van is a suspicious vehicle – number plates have been taken and reported.

9. NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE COUNCIL MATTERS

i. Reports from N.L.C representatives — Cllr Hannnigan advised the meeting that he had spoken to N.L.C regarding the section 106 agreements and the fact that often the money derived from these these agreements leaves the village. Section 106 money should ordinarily be put towards Leisure (Public Open Space), Schools and occasionally Highways. Cllr Hannigan advised the meeting that if the village of Ulceby is due section 106 money from future developments the parish council should advise the ward councillors of how they could utilize this money and they will put the parish councils case forward to N.L.C.

Cllr Clark advised the meeting that N.L.C have set their budget for the forthcoming financial year and have agreed a 2.9% increase in the general council tax. The community fund which serves parish councils and local voluntary groups will be available again for the forthcoming year.

- c) New matters to report: The Church lane sign opposite the co-op store needs a new post and the name plate reinstating. Clerk to report. The extended 30mph speed limit along Brocklesby Road is in consultation. Cllr Birtle asked how progress on the planning application on Station Road is monitored. This planning application will go to committee and the parish council and residents who objected will be advised when this planning application will be heard by the planning committee. A Resident can speak at the planning committee but must advise N.L.C that they intend to do so.

It was noted that the volume of HGV traffic through the village has reduced due to the traffic lights on Station Road.

It was noted that the website needs updating.

Pots holes are evident on Abbey Road and Martins Road – they need patching immediately - clerk to report to N.L.C.

The planned finish date for the drainage works on Coronation road is 12/4/19.
