#### **ULCEBY PARISH COUNCIL** CHAIRMAN'S WINTER REPORT **NOVEMBER 2019 – JANUARY 2020**

At the November meeting there was a complaint from a member of the public regarding surface water flooding in Martins Road and Station Road which had caused sewage drainage problems. Cllr Hannigan (NLC) had discussed this matter with Anglian Water to ensure there was no repeat of the difficulty.

There has been much discussion at recent Parish Council meetings regarding the establishment of an adult outdoor gym trail at the Village Hall, to be funded by S106 monies already received from Property Development in the village. It was agreed that a trail would be a wellreceived addition to the village amenities but the questions of exactly where to site it, the cost of the extra public liability insurance incurred and responsibility for costs of future maintenance of the equipment were all concerns. The Clerk agreed to investigate these questions prior to the February meeting. The Parish Council raised no objections to a planning request from BT for the removal of the phone box on the corner of Front Street and Cllr Wells said that the highways maintenance department at NLC were aware of the existence of a large pothole in the road at the level crossing. Action would be taken to rectify this.

Gratitude to the local Police was expressed for the speed enforcement which had recently taken place and the Ulceby Road Safety Group reported that Cllr Hannigan had taken steps to ensure that when there was a complete closure of the A180, traffic will be diverted through Ulceby in one direction only thereby ensuring that the village would not be in a 'lock-down' position again. The Parish Council continue to support the URSG in their endeavours to make the roads through Ulceby safer for all residents.


#### Chairman's Report Continued from page 1

The Clerk advised that a representative from the Community Speed Watch group was scheduled to attend a meeting on this subject at Scawby on 8<sup>th</sup> January and she would report to the February meeting any new information she was able to glean. Coun Birtles would draw up a list of all outstanding highways matters raised with NLC by the URSG group and this would be available for the February meeting.

Further clarification was awaited from NLC on the question of establishing an allotment and wild life/environmental area in the field behind Station Road. The Clerk advised that she had spoken to Cllr Hannigan who was arranging a meeting between the appropriate authorities and the Parish Council. Quotations would be sought for the repainting, in the Spring, of all the village benches and the War Memorial. Regarding the proposed development of 90 new properties at the top of Skitter Hill, three village residents would advise NLC of their intention to attend and speak against the development when the Appeal was heard at Scunthorpe on 25<sup>th</sup> February.

The precept was set during the January meeting and comment made that it was the Council's intention during the coming year to improve further the floral displays throughout the village and, hopefully, to site a large illuminated Christmas tree in an appropriate village location in time for Christmas 2020.

As part of an initial traffic review North Lincs Council have reduced the speed limit on the A1077 to 30mph. Brocklesby road speed reduction due.

Council Officers have undertaken a route assessment along the A1077, reviewing signs and road lining. Signs are being updated now.

This does not help with the HGV and volume of traffic problems so in January 2019 URSG raised a petition for a 7.5 tonne weight limit through the village. With backing from the petitioners, Parish Council and three Ward Councillors this petition was presented to North Lincs Council. After much deliberation including a subsequent appeal, North Lincs Council refused the petition. This we believe is the only real way to control the excessive traffic volume and weights. Subsequently we have proposed a trial period of the 7.5 T limit or overnight curfew. Reply awaited from the NLC.

It should be noted in discussions with local transport companies by URSG and NLC there have been positive and supportive actions. One supporting the village was the Ulceby Truck Stop, regarding vehicles using the village route to avoid the queuing at the new Habrough roundabout, discussions continue into 2020. Please note the 7.5 T limit would only effect HGV's passing through the village, all the HGV delivering to shops, farms, household, etc. are exempt from the limit. So as you can see from the above the village has been neglected for many years and this must stop. #### **ULCEBY ROAD SAFETY GROUP**

#### Update on actions to date and ongoing discussions for 2020

Our main objective is to make Ulceby Village a safer place for the community to live in, to allow the children to walk to and from school safely. All pedestrians to be able to cross the road safely and go about their daily lives.

Ulceby has the A1077 cutting right through it, there is only one continuous path through the whole village. There are no pedestrian crossings at all, most pedestrians need to cross this busy road at least twice to go about their daily business. To improve this, we have engaged with Ulceby Parish Council, North Lincolnshire Ward Councillors, the Council's traffic team, Highways England, the Police and other relevant Emergency services. One of our initial concerns was the amount of HGV traffic using the village on a daily basis, especially as there are two areas in the village where HGV's are unable to pass side by side without either using the footpath or pulling into the kerb side. The expansion of the Immingham docks and local storage areas to service them has not resulted in positive improvements to the traffic infrastructure such as A180 widening or a village bypass. Indeed, the A160 roundabout and gyratory has made some issues worse, built at great expense. Our local road (A1077) is simply not capable of carrying the bigger HGV's or increased volumes of traffic. Formerly a B road (B1358), it was changed to an A road (A1077) without any modification or improvements. The A180 was built to alleviate this traffic problem, only for it to return now. This problem is never more obvious to villagers than when the A180 is closed due to a DRUE (Diversion Resulting from Unplanned Event), traffic at a standstill in both directions, often for several hours. This has also had an effect on the B1211 and Front Street with increasing traffic trying to negotiate the small streets and the tight crossroads junction.

So what has been achieved, the following gives a quick update: - Getting the Council and Ward Councillors to acknowledge that we do have a problem with HGV's and other traffic in this village. Cllr Hannigan is supportive and has requested NLC traffic dept to implement an outside contractor review on the local road network, this covers all local villages. We have been in regular contact with MP Martin Vickers to ensure the national infrastructure is included in the discussions and any options raised.

NLC to engage with the local school, looking at school walking routes. Raised question of providing pedestrian crossings, review underway. Cllr Hannigan assisted with getting the DRUE route changed. It was left unchanged following its 2019 review by Highways England.





#### ST NICHOLAS CHURCH RESTORATION UPDATE FEBRUARY 2020



The grant from the Lottery Heritage Fund which has allowed the Friends Association to organise the restoration of St Nicholas Church, concluded at the end of January 2020! The last item chargeable to the HLF was the installation of the display cabinets along the North Aisle.

By the time this copy of the Link is printed, work will have begun on installing new electrics and lighting, courtesy of a grant from Wren (Communities Foundation) and work on new flooring should have been added to replace that beneath the removed pews in the North and South aisles, courtesy of a Community Grant from North Lincs Council. This latter project was also subsidised by the Friends from funding raised through your local support of us. We must also not forget our local Ulceby Co-Op from whom the Friends charity, in November, received the amazing sum of £1692.12, again through your support of our cause.

The Friends of St Nicholas Church came into being in September 2012 as a result of a public meeting to try to stop the closure of our beautiful Grade I listed village church. It has been a long and hard struggle, (not without its' many heartaches and disappointments) to ensure that all the things we set out to achieve that autumn were realised. By this Spring our church will be water-tight, have hot and cold running water in the new servery area, the facility of a disabled toilet, and gas central heating installed throughout. It will be enhanced by new electric wiring and atmospheric lighting, and the old and rotten pews will have been removed and replaced with new flooring. New, upmarket chairs and tables have been purchased so that the church's 'newly-released' community space area is available for events. Of course, there are other, smaller projects we wish to complete over time so our fund raising will continue with various events we shall stage, but the really hard work, thanks to the Heritage Lottery Grant and our wonderful supporters, is behind us.

There are so many people to thank, both individual and in groups that it is too difficult to know where we should begin. Suffice it to say that we realise that without your support, we could never have achieved what seemed, in 2012, the impossible. This is a time to celebrate now and we hope, before the end of this New Year of 2020, to hold a 'thank you' event in church, to which you will all be invited (details to follow later). In the meantime, why don't you attend one of our Sunday Services to see for yourself what determination and commitment from a village can achieve!!




