

ULCEBY PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

SUMMER UPDATE - JUNE JULY AND AUGUST 2020

Because of Covid 19, the Parish Council has not been able to meet monthly in the usual way and has had to adopt the practice of 'Zoom' meetings. These meetings have followed their normal pattern with Councillors able to attend 'virtually' rather than physically, so there has been 'business as usual' from our own homes, rather than a collective in the Village Hall.

Cllr Hannigan reported that, although he had requested that the fields behind Station Road and along Brocklesby Road be removed as potential for development (as shown in the recently published Local Development Plan), the consultation process was still on-going and he would therefore need to report back further in due course. Councillors unanimously objected to the Keigar development on Spruce Lane known as 'Riseholme' because of concerns over highway access safety. At July's meeting, the Parish Council supported the request of the Ulceby Road Safety Group that a further meeting between themselves and North Lincs Council be arranged in order for them to pursue their safer road proposals, however, such a meeting would probably be another victim of Covid 19 delay. Community Speed Watch training for those volunteers willing to take part had been delayed due to the social distancing restrictions but would be undertaken very shortly. Discussions on the siting of two pedestrian crossings in the village prompted a proposal that (1) a controlled crossing be established near the old Co-op and lay-by, (2) that an uncontrolled 'raised' crossing be sited on Station Road, and (3) that the lollypop lady be retained to supervise a crossing on Front Street for those children accessing school through Hallcroft along the public footpath. This proposal was unanimously agreed and the Clerk would write to Highways at NLC advising of the Parish Council's request.



Chairman's Report Continued from page 1

The Village Hall Committee had been approached to seek their views on the siting of an adult gym trail on the recreation field. Subject to the Village Hall being successful in obtaining all the necessary grants for the refurbishment of the children's play area, the Committee were happy for a adult gym trail to be incorporated (subject to certain conditions) on the site but should their applications for monetary grants towards the work be incomplete, the Committee would require \$106 monies from the Parish Council in order to finish the project. The Clerk would enquire as to how the \$106 money can be secured for our sole village use, whilst the two projects are being progressed.

All residents of Abbey Road are urged to report unpleasant drainage odours to Anglian Water to try to eradicate the problems there. The damaged road surface between Ulceby and Croxton had been inspected and would be repaired. Flower baskets for the village signs on Brocklesby Road and at the Skitter would be ordered and installed next spring. A proposal had been received with a request that an Angling Club be established at the Village Hall, with some initial financial input from the Parish Council to cover insurance. The Parish Council were supportive of this proposal but would require more details and assurances that the village hall was also in agreement. The Developer of the land behind the Co-op invited suggestions for the naming of that site, preferably (in order to perpetuate historical interest) to include the words 'Brocklesby Ox' in the title. Following discussion, it was suggested that the name should be 'Brocklesby Ox Rise'.



Top Tips for Getting on your Bike

With the government backing to get Britain cycling, as a newcomer it can be difficult to know where to start. Whether you prefer to cycle alone or want to join a group then here are a few invaluable tips to help you along your way...

- 1. Check your tyres: If your bike has been in the shed for a few months the tyres may be flat or even perished, pump them up, just so when you squeeze them there is a little give in them, if you have a pump with a pressure gauge, the recommended pressure for your tyres will usually be found on the tyre itself.
- 2. Check your brakes: pull on your brake levers and rock your bike back and forward it shouldn't move. If you are in any doubt as to the safety of your brakes you should seek professional help before venturing out.
- 3. Perform an 'M' check before you leave: This is a general safety check of your bike, instruction for this can be found widely on the internet.
- 4. Wear the correct gear: you don't have to be dressed in lycra just make sure your clothes aren't too loose, they are appropriate to the weather and you have a correctly fitting helmet.
- 5. Take food and drinks: you never know when dehydration or lack of energy will strike, it's always best to be prepared if you're out and about.
- 6. Take a light and a lock: anything can happen, it's best not to be unprepared, you may want to pop into the shop for an extra drink (don't forget to take your mask if required) or be delayed after dark by a puncture. Personally, when riding along roads, I'd always recommend using at least a rear light to increase visibility.
- 7. Kit to carry: You need to carry a puncture repair kit this could be patches or a spare inner tube, a pump that works with your bike and tyre levers. It is also a good idea to keep some cash with these too, just in case. This can be easily carried on the bike with an underseat saddle bag or even in an empty sports water bottle.
- 8. Plan your route: start small, don't take on Elsham Hill on your first ride! There is a huge number of country roads at our disposal in this area. Great for building confidence and exploring the glorious countryside.
- 9. Make friends: say Hi to your fellow cyclists, everyone likes a nod or cheery 'Hello' as you go past. You could also join a local club or guided ride if you don't want to go it alone.





North Lincolnshire Council is committed to working with bus companies to provide the best possible public transport for our communities. As time has gone by and most people now own cars, rural bus services have gradually become unprofitable for the bus companies. In response to this North Lincolnshire Council have provided large financial subsidies to assist the bus companies to continue to keep rural services going.

As passenger numbers have fallen year on year it is disheartening to see 50 seat buses running mostly empty whilst burning large quantities of diesel fuel. It makes no economic sense and is damaging the environment. To improve this situation North Lincolnshire procured a demand responsive bus service known as Call Connect. This service used smaller, cleaner buses and made journeys only when requested.

Whilst largely successful it was recognised that passengers needed more flexibility and improved reliability particularly when booking essential journeys such as visits to hospitals and doctors. North Lincolnshire Council has therefore commissioned a new demand responsive service known as Just Go North Lincs which became available on September 7th 2020. This service can be booked up to one month ahead or on the day it is required.

The best means of booking the Just Go bus is by using the Just Go app which can be downloaded from Google Play or the Apple App Store. Alternatively buses can be booked by dialling 01482 592929.

COVID 19 has caused many problems for public transport and Just Go has been affected because social distancing has limited the number of passengers to 7 per vehicle. This has sometimes limited the flexibility of the service but there will be sufficient capacity for all users once restrictions are lifted.

Another unfortunate consequence of COVID 19 is that passenger numbers have fallen to such a degree that Stagecoach are no longer able to run the 450 service which ceased on 29th August 2020. There is however good news as the 250 service has been diverted to include Ulceby, Wootton and Thornton Curtis linking these villages to Grimsby, Cleethorpes and Barton on a more regular basis.

Your ward and parish councillors have advocated strongly for reliable bus services that link our villages to larger towns so please don't hesitate to contact us to provide feedback on the new services.
