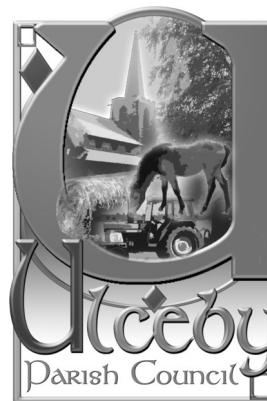

## ULCEBY PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

### AUTUMN UPDATE – SEPTEMBER OCTOBER and NOVEMBER 2020

Because of the dreaded virus, we have had to continue with our 'zoom' meetings, and, despite the occasional technical hiccup over internet connections, we have been able to continue with the business of the village. Regarding the Parish Pump area, the Electricity Board and village gardeners will co-ordinate to ensure this area is pruned and tidied, and delivery is awaited of additional waste bins for Brocklesby Road and Abbey Road. A survey of all the village seats to determine necessary repairs/replacement is being undertaken and preparation of the village Emergency Plan continues. The village Christmas tree will be sited within the boundary of the war memorial where Health & Safety regulations will be met, and possible storm damage limited. The British Legion representative has been consulted to ensure no offence would be caused to any families.

Training of 5 volunteers to undertake community speed watch activities took place in October, following which some successful results were obtained when this training was put into practice. The Abbey Road area will shortly be subjected to this same procedure since speeding motorists create a danger there. The Clerk is to seek further details/ costs of updated speed reduction signs for the village and NLC will be contacted again regarding the necessity to resurface Abbey Road, Skitter Hill and the B1211 road to Croxton, which has further deteriorated. Responses regarding a request for a weight limit through the village and results of a meeting with a haulier due to be involved

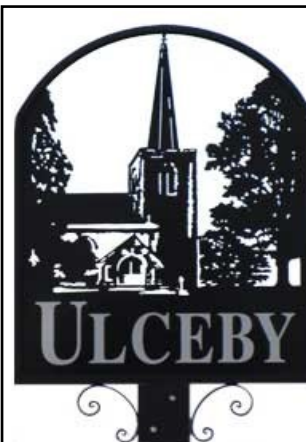
shortly in extensive journeys on the A1077, are still awaited, together with news of more police support following details gained from the 'golden rivers' speed monitoring equipment recently employed.

Contact is still being sought with Anglian Water to discuss the ongoing odour emissions in Abbey Road.

The Clerk would make arrangements for the pavements to be cleared back and hedges trimmed in the West End and Skitter Hill areas and, following lengthy discussions, the Clerk was also asked to write to the Highways Department/Traffic Division to log the Parish Council's disappointment and dissatisfaction with the lack of responses or explanations from them in reply to recent objections and requests involving their Department, e.g. prohibited parking at the Co-op layby, concern over access onto the A1077 from new build properties etc. etc., because it would seem that no heed is ever paid to the concerns of the Parish Council.

The Parish Council will meet again in the New Year and, in the meantime, we wish all of our village residents the joys of the Season with the hope that we all remain safe and well and virus-free.

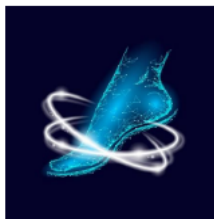

There are some simple steps you can take that will protect you from the most common scams.

### 1 - Watch out for scam messages


Your bank, or other official organisations, won't ask you to share personal information over email or text. If you receive an email you're not quite sure about, forward it to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS): [report@phishing.gov.uk](mailto:report@phishing.gov.uk)

### 2 - Shopping online

If you're making a purchase from a company or person you don't know and trust, carry out some research first, for example, by checking to see if others have used the site and what their experience was. If you decide to go ahead with the purchase, use a credit card if you have one, other payment providers may not provide the same protection.

### 3 - Unsolicited calls and browser pop-ups offering tech support

Never install any software, or grant remote access to your computer, as a result of a cold call. Remember, legitimate organisations would never contact you out of the blue to ask for financial details such as your PIN or full banking password.

## ULCEBY POND

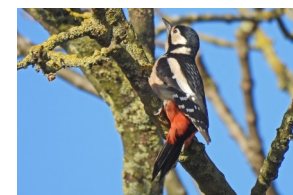
Pond now and future

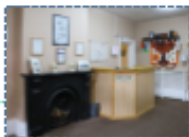

## ULCEBY ROAD SAFETY GROUP REPORT 2020

Hello fellow villagers

Please find below the latest details of ongoing discussions and some progress relating to the safety of the roads throughout the village. Our main objective is still to make Ulceby Village a safer place for the community to live - to allow the children to walk to and from school safely, to allow them to play safely, and for all pedestrians to be able to cross the road safely, to get to their destination, Co-op, Church, Station etc.

Ulceby road safety group (URSG) have the full backing of the Parish Council with whom we try to work in conjunction with on these safety related issues. URSG are still pushing the authorities to implement a 7.5 ton weight limit in the village for the daily rat run traffic as this is seen as the only viable solution. In the event of an accident on the A180 with a single carriageway closure, the traffic will be directed through Ulceby but if both carriageways are closed, traffic will be diverted through Ulceby from one carriageway and the other carriageway through Brocklesby.

Our main issues remain the areas in the village that we have highlighted as pinch points. Areas including Spruce Lane and Halmshaw's bend (West end of the village), where HGV traffic uses the footpath to pass. This, we feel is dangerous and unacceptable and we have asked N.L.C to look at ways to alleviate this problem. Unfortunately the size of the HGV's today have outgrown our rural village.

URSG have had very good conversations recently with regards to a weight limit with the Police Inspector for this area and we are currently waiting for a meeting with his boss Chief Superintendent Wildbore. Also we have made contact with the new Police TMO who coordinates traffic policy for the Humberside Police, operating out of Melton on the other side of the Humber. We hope to have a local meeting once it's possible.

Just so everyone is aware of the problem which is growing on a daily basis, logistics companies have been granted planning permission to locate in our rural villages without ensuring there are enforceable controls on the routes to and from the sites. This affects, Ulceby, Nth Killingholme, Wooton, Goxhill and Thornton Curtis, all in the Ferry Ward. Using the villages as a rat run, haulage contractors are moving material between Immingham docks and Goxhill, New Holland or JHP storage. In October a cargo of 40,000 tonnes of Biomass was put into storage at Goxhill for Drax power station. Hargreaves transport were contacted when seen carrying this cargo, they acknowledged our problem and agreed to use the A180/A15 route instead of the village. Other companies, some local, are not as responsible and don't care, only considering the shortest, fastest route. This is why a 7.5 tonne limit is needed to enforce responsible behaviour on hauliers when necessary.

We have also recently had talks with the **BRAKE** road safety charity who have kindly donated some new "No Need to Speed" signage which we will put up at various points in the village. We have also had talks with **RoSPA** who have been very helpful and given us some new ideas to address the safety issues within the village. We are

still awaiting previously agreed face to face talks with Andrew Charnick of Highways England, which have been delayed by COVID-19. This was regarding the diversion route for the A180 and to see what can be done to alleviate the problems seen in this village when the road is closed.

Community Speed Watch (**CSW**) is up and running. This is a national initiative where active members of local communities join with the support of the Police and Parish Council to monitor speeds. Recently we have been quite concerned about the amount of traffic and its speeds. URSG asked for a traffic survey to be done in the village to check volume, type and speeds. This was eventually provided indirectly by the need for the Police to check the new 30mph and 50mph zones coming into the village. 3 more volunteers are required - please contact Parish council clerk Karen Pickering [adair1@btinternet.com](mailto:adair1@btinternet.com) if you would like to be involved. Full training is given, please come and make a difference.

Information received back from the traffic survey revealed that over a 7 day period a total of 15,630 vehicles passed over the monitor (on Skitter Hill) of those 53.63% were above the 35mph threshold. That equates to 1,198 offenders a day, so expect to see more speed checks carried out by the police in the near future.

You should have seen the recent update of road signs - 97 in total have been renewed or installed around the village, although a couple of signs have been incorrectly labelled. These will be replaced, the rest are complete. The road which was in bad repair down Skitter Hill was resurfaced in March, again with pressure applied from the URSG. The last 200 metres to the station will be completed by NLC when permission from Network Rail has been achieved. The road to Croxton, South bound carriageway will be repaired by N.L.C in the next financial year.

The Parish Council has petitioned N.L.C for pedestrian crossings in the village, one close to the centre and one near to the proposed new housing development on Station Road. This request is being considered and a consultation process is on-going by N.L.C.

URSG are also pushing for alterations to be made in line with the transport statement submitted as part of the planning application for the Co-Op service area back in 2015 (PA/2015/0312) when it was stated the following **To prevent parking within the servicing area, parking restrictions will be implemented. These will include yellow lines on West End Road and Church Lane with plates stating no stopping except for loading.** This has not happened and is outstanding and we have received numerous complaints of vehicles pulling out of the service bay into oncoming traffic, especially HGV traffic, even reversing down Church Lane - another unsafe act and an accident waiting to happen and another example of lack of planning compliance.
