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A meeting of Ulceby Parish Council was held on Monday 16th August 2021 at 7.00pm in the village hall.

PUBLIC FORUM

A member of the public asked if any update was available on the owners of the spare land at the entrance to Advent court. The clerk advised that ownership had not been established. Residents of the court have tidied up the area and planted shrubs/flowers etc to make the area more attractive. This new garden area now has a ‘no parking’ sign on it. S Smith advised the meeting that N.L.C had been unsuccessful in their bid for funding for infrastructure improvements to cope with the new ‘Free Port’ status at Immingham. S Smith advised that the freight strategy report was due to be delivered in June and will now not be available until the end of October.

S Smith advised that M Vickers MP has indicated that the ‘Free Port’ money may be used to upgrade the A180 but this, if it happens, is likely to happen at the time of the ‘free port’ status and not before.

M Birtle advised the meeting that permission had been granted for an extra 60 tractor units to use a yard at Killingholme which is likely to impact on traffic through Ulceby.

S Smith advised that he felt the road through Ulceby was not safe, the figures used by N.L.C and the Highway Agency to indicate that the road is fit for purpose are historic and not relevant to the traffic actually using the road through Ulceby today.

M Birtle suggested that N.L.C appear not to want a 7.5T weight limit for the village of Ulceby or to reduce the volume of traffic through the village and Ulceby will suffer more than any other village with the ‘Free Port’ status.

8. Police Matters :

- a) Community Speed Watch – The community speed watch group is active and Wayne Goodwin is encouraging the group to undertake monitoring as much as possible. The latest monitoring indicated that 15% were travelling above the speed limit. There are 9 members within the community speed watch group and current monitoring sites are Skitter hill and Brocklesby Road. Clerk to obtain the traffic data recorded from ‘Golden Rivers’ monitoring on Abbey Road.
- b) NATS meeting – The next meeting is scheduled for 29th September 2021 followed by 22nd December 2021 both at 4pm on TEAMS.

9. North Lincolnshire Council Matters:

a) Reports from N.L.C representatives: Cllr Clark suggested that the data collected from the pedestrian count undertaken in the village look encouraging to suggest a pedestrian crossing is necessary. N.L.C have indicated that a pedestrian crossing will be put in place at the school crossing – High Street/ Front street/Abbey Road area.

Cllr wells advised that The Brocklesby Estate had applied for land to be included within the local plan for a 200 vehicle lorry park at the back of Gallows Wood / Barnetby Top area.

b) Road Safety :

- i. Updates on the road safety initiative – S Smith is trying to arrange a meeting with M Vickers MP, URSG, Goxhill representatives, Ulceby PC and N.L.C representatives to try and get a unified approach from all the surrounding villages to improve the volume of HGV traffic through all the local villages.
- ii. Pedestrian Count in Ulceby – The data has been received and noted and it appears that a pedestrian crossing will be installed within the village.
- iii. Website calendar page for community speed watch volunteers to diary dates – Kyanite consulting have advised that this is not entirely straight forward , although possible. The cost is likely to be £80. M Birtle advised that the group would operate with ‘Teams’ for the time being.
- iv. Bus Stop – Front Street – The clerk met two representatives from N.L.C to discuss the positioning of this bus stop. A neighbouring resident also put forward their views on the location of the bus stop. All alternative locations were considered but at the present moment in time the bus stop will remain in its original position.
- c) Station Road – land for community garden/allotments etc – clerk still trying to find suitable companies to plan this project. The lease has not yet been formalised on this land with N.L.C.
- d) New matters to report: Clerk was asked to find out when the grant application for the solar activated speed signs will be discussed and decided.
- Station Road – through Skitter will remain at 30mph.
- S Smith will send a copy of a letter from N.L.C to Cllr D Wells indicating that Ulceby had been promised ‘Dragons Teeth’ and Roundel road markings to encourage traffic to slow down through the village. These road markings have not appeared. Traffic calming measures were discussed for the entrance to The Skitter – from the A180 – opposite the pub to advise drivers they are entering a village and encourage traffic to slow down.

It was suggested that an Inter- parish meeting be arranged – Thornton Curtis, Wootton, Goxhill, North Killingholme, Barrow to discuss HGV movements through all the villages – it was agreed that this would not be arranged until the freight Strategy report had been received.
It was noted that the underpass at the quarry had been cleared and metal grids placed on the drains to hopefully encourage drainage of this area.
