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A meeting of Ulceby Parish Council was held on Monday 19th July 2021 at 7.00pm in the village hall.

IN ATTENDANCE: Mrs K Pickering(Clerk), Four members of the public.

PUBLIC FORUM

A member of the public attended the meeting to advise the parish council that he felt the findings within the route assessment report were nothing more than a tick box exercise, the data provided within the assessment was historic and of no relevance to today's traffic movements through the village and he felt that in some instances the figures had been manipulated to try and prove that a weight limit through the village was unnecessary. He felt that the same people who had undertaken the review for a weight limit in 2019(after a petition had been lodged) had been involved in this latest route assessment and that they had no intention of giving a weight limit for this village due consideration. The member of the public felt that an independent company should have been appointed to undertake this route assessment.

It was noted that work undertaken in the village recently has been routine maintenance work and not improvement works to create traffic calming measures.

A member of the public advised that he had spoken to Martin Vickers MP who has advised that the Government is intending to upgrade the A180 to 3 lanes and the member of the public suggested that a weight limit through the village is essential before the extra port traffic commences.

A member of the public advised that if HGV traffic was removed from the village, 95% of the risk would be removed and it would put all haulage companies on an equal footing. It was noted that the radar activated speed sign on Station Road is positioned too high and is therefore not recording accurate data through the village.

The clerk was asked to try and obtain the freight strategy report as soon as possible as it is now overdue.

A member of the public advised that the waste area of land to the entrance of Advent Court has been tidied up by residents however the owner has not been located.

IT WAS RESOLVED that the minutes of the parish council meeting held on 21st June 2021 be confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

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4. Clerks Updates:

- i. Emergency Plan – The residents helping with the emergency plan have suggested a meeting with the clerk and possibly a parish councillor representative. Clerk to arrange.
- ii. Neighbourhood Plan – A meeting with D Lofts will be arranged in due course.
- iii. Radar activated/solar speed awareness signs – grant application – this application is finally complete and has been processed by N.L.C. Waiting for the grants committee to consider the application at their next meeting.
- iv. Footpaths on Skitter Hill, West End Road, Brocklesby Road – scraping back – N.L.C have been in contact and will scrape back the footpaths imminently.
- v. ‘Please drive carefully’ sign for Skitter end of village – quote still pending.
- vi. Dog Bin – Coronation Road – suitable location still being sought.
- vii. Church yard – Mowing – The Chairman and clerk visited the churchyard and the ‘old graves’ area has now been mowed. The chairman and clerk reported to the meeting that the front of the churchyard – for which the church is responsible – is very overgrown and unkempt and doesn’t appear to be looked after at all. Clerk to write to the church and ask when they are going to tidy up the area they are responsible for.
- viii. Advent Court – garden area – see public forum section.
- ix. Pollution test/monitoring – Ulceby Village – A report from N.L.C has been received and noted that there are no pollution problems in the village.
- x. Road surface/pavements at Hallcroft – N.L.C have agreed to inspect.

5. Planning Applications - Opportunity for one person from each side (members of the public to state within three minutes objections/support of contested applications.

- a) Application PA/2021/1117 – Planning permission to change use from former co-op to Indian restaurant – Co-op store, Spruce lane, Ulceby.

IT WAS RESOLVED unanimously to OBJECT to this planning application for the following reasons:

- Lack of adequate and safe parking in the vicinity
 - Traffic generation in an already very busy main street with excessive HGV traffic, further traffic generated by deliveries and customers of the restaurant, causing highway safety concerns.
 - Environmental concerns and loss of quality of life concerns due to excessive smells created by the proposed development.
- b) To advise the parish council of correspondence received from a resident on Thornton Lane regarding the new build in this vicinity and that the response received from the enforcement officer indicates that the build complies with the planning conditions to date.

a) Community Speed Watch – Five more volunteers have been trained (9 volunteers in total are now available) and it was noted that the police will be more proactive in areas the CSW group cannot operate.

It was noted that the ‘Golden Rivers’ on Abbey road were not situated in the right place and were therefore ineffective.

b) NATS meeting – A meeting was held in July with fly tipping and the introduction of cctv to catch people fly tipping and traffic on footpaths(report as a near miss on the N.L.C website).

The next NATS meeting is scheduled for 29th September 2021.

- b) Road Safety :
 - i. Updates on the road safety initiative – discussed under public forum.
 - ii. Pedestrian Count in Ulceby – No data received from N.L.C as yet
 - iii. Website calendar page for community speed watch volunteers to diary dates – The meeting agreed to host such a page on the parish council website. Kyanite consulting are trying to set this up..
 - iv. Bus Stop – Front Street – to discuss correspondence received from a resident of front Street and advise of response from N.L.C. A resident wrote to the parish council advising that he felt that the bus stop – outside the Fox Inn public house was an unsuitable and unsafe location. He has sent his concerns to N.L.C and N.L.C have agreed to a site meeting with a parish council representative, stage coach representative to try and agree on the most suitable location for this bus stop.
- c) Station Road – land for community garden/allotments etc – clerk still trying to find suitable companies to plan this project. The lease has not yet been formalised on this land with N.L.C.
- d) New matters to report: It was suggested that the flower beds in the village were a little ‘invisible’ and could J Nettleton be approached to make them into raised beds. The clerk advised that this is possible but is quite expensive and it might be a project to undertake over a number of years until all the beds are raised.
