

## 2021/22 – 27

A meeting of Ulceby Parish Council was held on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> October 2021 at 7.00pm in the village hall.

### PUBLIC FORUM

A member of the public advised the meeting that the community speed watch programme is continuing but it is a struggle to get volunteers out on a regular basis. Wayne Goodwin has advised that communication with him should just be through the co-ordinator of the scheme which proves difficult when the co-ordinator is not always available.

Unfortunately the community speed watch team were subjected to verbal abuse recently which has been reported to the police, unfortunately no feed back has been received from the police.

It was reported that the solar sign situated adjacent the village hall is only recording 1 in 5 vehicles : Clerks note: N.L.C have tested this device and advise that it is working perfectly – however it does not record vehicles travelling at below 25mph.

Mr R Derbyshire attended the meeting to advise that after 16 years he is standing down as one of the parish council representatives on the Ulceby School Endowment Trust. The clerk advised that this will be an agenda item to appoint a new parish council representative to this trust next month.

3. **Adoption of the minutes of the monthly parish council meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2021.**  
**IT WAS RESOLVED** that the minutes of the parish council meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2021 be confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.
4. **Clerks Updates:**
  - a) Emergency Plan – A meeting will be arranged as soon as possible.
  - b) Neighbourhood Plan – D Lofts attending the November parish council meeting.
  - c) Hallcroft – road and footpath repairs – No repairs as yet.
  - d) Walkers Way– Paths and overhanging tree branches – this walkway/path has not been cleared.
  - e) High Street – drain jetting and village curb side spraying – drain jetting has been undertaken – no sign of weed spraying as yet.
  - f) Public footpaths – update on mowing and repairs – contractor has been booked to undertake the last cut for the year. N.L.C have agreed to look at the overgrown section of the footpath along the quarry top.
  - g) Funding Policy – The policy and funding application form was presented to councillors for consideration. The meeting unanimously agreed to adopt this policy and application form.

- c) To give consideration to financially supporting the local football club. Paper circulated by email and further paper circulated with agenda.  
Cllr Ogden expressed concerns regarding supporting adult leisure activities.  
The meeting **RESOLVED** to provide funding up to a maximum of £500 to purchase a new white line marker, 4 corner flags and a pair of nets. The invoice will be to Ulceby Parish Council and the equipment will be stored at the village hall and any groups playing on the village hall pitches can use this equipment.

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### 7. Police Matters :

- a) Community Speed Watch – see notes under public forum.
- b) NATS meeting - The meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> September 2021 noted antisocial behaviour in some villages and fly tipping has occurred on Brocklesby Road. Next meeting scheduled for 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2021 at 4pm on TEAMS.

### 8. North Lincolnshire Council Matters:

a) Reports from N.L.C representatives: Cllr P Clark reported that a Lincolnshire day had been held with representatives from North Lincolnshire, North East Lincolnshire and Lincolnshire County Council with a view to promoting the historic county of Lincolnshire.

#### b) Road Safety :

- i. Updates on the road safety initiative and freight report – 1<sup>st</sup> draft of the freight report is currently being considered by N.L.C officers. Cllr Hannigan advised that Ward Councillors were meant to be reviewing the findings of this report with N.L.C officers but unfortunately this had to be postponed due to an officers emergency. Cllr Ogden asked when the parish council would see the freight strategy report – Cllr Hannigan advised that he could not give a date for the report to be shared more widely.

The meeting held at The Truck Stop with representatives of URSG, N.L.C and the owners of the Truck Stop highlighted a number of initiatives which could discourage truck drivers from turning left when exiting the site and travelling through the village. Most of the initiatives and recommendations are to be implemented by the Truck Stop owners.

- ii. Radar activated speed sign – A radar activated solar sign, provided by N.L.C, has been put in place adjacent the village hall. The parish council radar solar speed sign has been ordered and will be dispatched once payment has been received. The sign will be delivered to N.L.C who will provide and fit the post and fit the speed sign and solar panel. N.L.C will invoice for this accordingly.

c) Station Road – land for community garden/allotments etc – clerk still trying to find suitable companies to plan this project. The lease has not yet been formalised on this land with N.L.C. This project is to be advertised with the Link magazine and Ulceby Parish Council Facebook page and it was suggested that a community group be formed to take this project forward.

d) New matters to report: Ward Councillors were asked about the 'Back to Bus' strategy, Cllr Hannigan advised that N.L.C were determined to make the 'Just Go' bus service work.

**10. Environmental and Village issues**

- a) Village Seats, public footpath sign and waste bin – Church Lane. The public footpath sign has been put in place, suitable locations are still being sought for the seat and waste bin.
- b) New matters to report – Inconsiderate parking by parents dropping off school children in the Hallcroft area was discussed. This is causing the bin lorry to mount the pavement and cause damage to the curb. The mobile library is also parking across driveways preventing residents from leaving their properties with vehicles. Double yellow lines and a yellow hatched box was discussed.
- c) Clerks Note: Subsequently Cllr Hannigan has raised this problem with the N.L.C traffic enforcement team who will visit the area at school drop off/pick up times and leaflet offending cars.  
The problem of cars parking on the left hand side to the entrance to the co-op was also raised – these cars parked inconsiderately make it very difficult for vehicles to enter/exit the car park.  
The village Christmas tree was discussed and the clerk agreed to arrange the purchase of the tree. Cllr Jeffery is to be asked to source suitable outdoor, LED lights for the tree – possibly large bulb lights ? Clerk to discuss with Cllr Jeffery.  
The wreath for Remembrance Sunday has been ordered and will be delivered.
