- b) Road Safety :
 - i. Additional radar speed signs in Ulceby clerk to arrange site meeting with N.L.C representatives in the new year to agree suitable sites.
 - ii. Weight Limit for Ulceby and surrounding villages This trial weight limit has commenced, however data is still recording a similar number of HGV's travelling through the village – it is hoped that once all companies are aware of the weight limit there will be a reduction in HGV's travelling through the village. It was noted that there was an HGV parked in the lay-by on West End road this evening, which is likely to travel through the village in the morning.
- Double yellow lines (reduction of) outside the Abdals The double yellow lines have been extended to where they were originally and a RTO is to be issued to try and have the double yellow lines extended as far as the village hall. This RTO will incorporate a disabled parking bay on High Street.
 Unfortunately it was noted that a number of cars are parking on the double yellow lines outside Abdals

c) Station Road – land for community garden/allotments: Lease: The break clause of 5 years has now been agreed by N.L.C. The parish councils solicitor is negotiating the terminology used regarding the responsibility for flooding in the lease (it has been reworded since the original lease was issued) – solicitor asking for the wording to be reverted to the original lease. The clerk has asked the solicitor to query with N.L.C the clause regarding the maintenance of the hedges to the West and East boundary – in that the lease states that these hedges must be maintained by the parish council – these hedges have not been maintained by N.L.C and the clerk has suggested that N.L.C maintain them to the standard they wish the parish council to maintain them to during the period of the lease.

d) New matters to report: Vehicles appear to be parking on the footpath on Church lane junction – near the 3 tier planter – it is hoped this was just for removal purposes but will be monitored. There was a request for a road sweeper at the Abbey Road junction as debris from the new pedestrian crossing has washed to the crossroads.
