

# Ulceby Parish Council

#### CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT April 2022 – March 2023

Of all the progress I have to report on this year, two of the most important concern road safety.

Firstly, a commencement of an eighteen-month trial period of a 7.5 cwt weight limit through the village. Approximately 10 companies continued to flout this rule initially, however those involved were approached by the Police and duly agreed to redress this situation. Secondly, after many years, we at last have been able to establish a pedestrian crossing at the High Street/Spruce Lane junction. These two significant changes will, hopefully, improve the safety of all villagers. Neither of these achievements would have been realised without the support to the Parish Council of the Ulceby Road Safety Group.

The introduction of further planned speed monitoring signs, and a possible extension of the double yellow lines between Abdal's Restaurant and the entrance to the village hall, should reduce the problem of dangerous and inconsiderate parking and further aid village safety.

As promised last year, the purchase of three waterfall-design planters was made to mark the late Queen's Jubilee and we are considering the purchase of an ornamental metal sculpture to mark the King's forthcoming Coronation. Queries regarding use of the land behind


You will recall that, last November, it was decided that we would not increase the precept for the current financial year but continue to improve the village amenities, whilst remaining within our current budget.





DON'T DEAL WITH COLD CALLERS such as Nottingham Knockers. Do not make up-front payments to any cold callers. NEVER allow them into your home.

- If you are aware of such traders visiting your neighbourhood, please report any such activity to the Police immediately, using the nonemergency number, 101. Give as much information as you can such as times dates, descriptions and vehicle registration numbers. By doing this you may help prevent crime.
- Report any suspicions about other types of door-to-door selling to Citizens Advice consumer helpline 0808 223 1133, giving as much information as you can, such as business names and addresses.



Humberside Police are proud to be supporting the national StreetSafe online tool that lets people anonymously pinpoint on a map a location where they don't feel safe. You can access the online tool here on the Police UK website http://www.police.uk/streetsafe

StreetSafe has been introduced as part of the national response to tackling Violence Against Women & Girls and to identify areas where there are fears caused by other things such as anti-social behaviour & environmental issues. This is just one step in a national approach to tackling Violence Against Women & Girls and the initial pilot has now been extended.

Anyone who has concerns about a particular location is encouraged to flag it through the tool.

The online StreetSafe tool is very easy to use and includes a short series of sections to complete, with guidance every step of the way. To pinpoint the area of concern, you can place a pin in the online map or enter the location.

## If you have any concerns about a particular location, we invite you to flag it through the tool.

This information will be considered alongside the extensive evidence base already gathered by police forces and used to inform the community safety activities of police and partner agencies such as local authorities. No crime needs to have been committed to enable you to indicate where you feel unsafe, and it is important to remember that the StreetSafe tool should not be used to report crimes.
