

# **Ulceby Parish Council**

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT May – July 2023

Firstly, may we make a plea to all those residents throughout the village whose gardens have hedges which front the pavements. Will you please endeavour to cut these back in order to avoid the possibility of harm to pedestrians (both adult and children) from scratches and thorns. Those members of our community who have to use disability scooters are also in danger and your co-operation in trimming your hedges would be much appreciated.

To update you regarding ongoing matters, we are awaiting delivery of a new litter bin in Abbey Road and, likewise, the sign at the Crossroads on Thornton Lane is awaiting repair by NLC. The Community Speed Watch team have reported motorists using Brocklesby Road at excessive speeds with one vehicle being recorded as travelling at 103 mph. The Clerk has applied for a grant to purchase additional radar speed signs and a response to this application is awaited. Likewise, a response is awaited from the approach by NLC to the Truck Stop Management regarding establishing a solid white line and 'Stop' signs at the exit on to Killingholme Road. At the July meeting, Cllr Hannigan advised that all parties involved are agreed that the weight limit zone trial has exceeded all expectations in effectiveness and itis hoped that the weight restrictions will remain in force following the trial period.

Consultation regarding extension of the double yellow lines along Spruce Lane is not yet complete, however, 'No Loading restrictions' and a parking bay for use by disabled drivers has been agreed. Following complaints at





the July meeting by residents of Abbey Road about excessive and inconsiderate parking there, NLC Councillors suggested a petition of residents be filed with North Lincs Council for a 'residents only' parking area to be established, possibly, making part of the grassed area in front of Friarsgate into resident's parking. The attending residents agreed to raise such a petition. The War Memorial railings will be repainted and repairs regarding the entrance to Yarborough Count, including the need for a dropped kerb, would be reported to NLC.

The lease of the land behind Station Road has now been signed and the Parish Council became responsible for the same at the end of June. The Landscape Consultant from Goxhill will be approached again with a view to drawing up a formal plan for the area and it was noted that this will need to be an ongoing Parish Council project, completed in small stages over a period of time.



## OVER HANGING HEDGES, BUSHES AND TREES

As I walk around Ulceby I notice that there are an increasing number of hedges, bushes and trees that are affecting the use of the public foothpaths. Some of these are the responsibility of land owners but an increasing number of offenders belong to home owners.

Did you know it is an offence under the Highway Act of 1980 to "allow, trees, hedges, shrubs and so on to obstruct the highway". Highway is classified as road and foothpath. Whilst I appreciate that many hedges provide nesting places for birds, the hedge/shrub/ tree can still be pruned back to allow safe passage on a foothpath without disturbing the nest. In fact once June has arrived any fledgling will have been ousted out to make its own way in life so nothing will be disturbed if trimming is undertaken.

Strictly speaking the growth should be trimmed back to the border line of the property but if there is grass below then trimming so it only overhangs your grass and not the footpath, would be acceptable.

As a last resort the council after giving notice, have the right to cut the hedge and charge the owner for doing so!

Nobody wants to go down this route so if you could check to see if your flora is overhanging a footpath and if so to trim it back, that would be great. I have to do this with my shrubs at least twice a year and to be honest it does the shrub a lot of good and no harm. It also helps to stop moss etc from growing on the path, as moss does love shady conditions!

Please, Let's keep our foothpaths user friendly and not overtaken by overhanging greenery forcing people to have to walk on the road.

# Lincoln & Lindsey Blind Society

If you have a sight impairment or know someone who may be struggling with their evesight then the Lincoln and Lindsev Blind Society may be the able to help. Based in Louth, our charity is entirely independent serving visually impaired people throughout North and North East Lincolnshire, East and West Lindsey and Lincoln City.



Severe visual impairment such as blindness or partial sight that cannot be corrected by spectacles is extremely debilitating because you lose your sight and you can lose more than just your ability to see. It can feel like your world is falling apart. Those who have lost some or all of their vision always welcome empathy from people who care but they also need equipment, practical advice and training so they can get on with their lives despite sight loss.

Sufferers do not have to be registered with a visual impairment or even have a referral from a doctor or optometrist to get our help. The person themselves, a family member or a friend can telephone, email, call in person or write to us and we will send a Sight Impairment Officer to visit and carry out an assessment, our contact details are at the bottom of this article.

As well as our Sight Impairment Officers we have an army of volunteers who receive on-going support, guidance and training and can take on a range of roles, from helping at Social Groups, recording our talking newspapers, Befriending, helping at Eye Clinics, or with administration, fundraising, IT support or as a Trustee. At present we serve 1460 people in our area, 75% of whom are over 65, with new referrals coming in every week. Many more use our services but are not on our formal register. We are a local independent charity and we receive no government, local authority or statutory funding, all our funds come from bequests, charitable donations and charitable grants.
