A meeting of Ulceby Parish Council was held on Monday 17th July 2023 at 7.00pm in the village hall.

PUBLIC FORUM

Members of the public attended the meeting to advise councillors of the inconsiderate and excessive parking of cars along Abbey Road and Friarsgate. Residents are having difficulty parking outside their properties or anywhere near their properties and this is giving cause for concern regarding the security of their vehicles. Cllr Hannigan advised the meeting that this was not a strong safety issue but agreed it was very inconvenient for residents and Cllr Clark suggested residents 'petition' N.L.C to try and get an area of Abbey Road designated as residents parking only. A discussion also took place regarding making the grassed area in front of Friarsgate into residents parking. The members of the public agreed to raise a petition which will be sent onto N.L.C in due course.

 - Hedge – Front Street – N.L.C have inspected this hedge and asked the resident to cut it back from the pavement. The shape of this hedge does still make it overhang the pavement to some extent.

a) Reports from N.L.C representatives: Cllr Hannigan advised the meeting that all parties feel that the trial weight limit has exceeded all expectations in terms of effectiveness. Most lorries stopped when travelling within the weight limit zone have legitimate reasons for being within the weight limit zone. The Police have indicated that they view the weight limit zone favourably and therefore it is hoped that the weight limit restrictions will remain in force once the trial period has finished.

b) Road Safety :

- i. Additional radar speed signs in Ulceby – The clerk has submitted a grant application to the Police and Crime Commissioners fund – the result of this application will be known after the closing date for applications in June.
- ii. Weight Limit for Ulceby and surrounding villages – See minute 9(a).
- iii. HGV's exiting Truck Stop – No further update received. The clerk made contact with Ian Jickells of N.L.C twice requesting an update on this matter. This matter has now been referred to Gareth Denoven at N.L.C. Cllr Clark will progress this matter.
- iv. Double yellow lines/ No loading restriction/disable parking space (High Street) – consultation commenced 22/6/23 and has just about finished. At present this TRO provides the 'No Loading' restrictions and a disabled bay on High Street. An extension of the double yellow lines up to the village hall will have to form another TRO with further consultation in due course.

c) Station Road – land for community garden/allotments: Lease completed, field mowed. It was agreed that the landscaping consultant from Goxhill will be contacted again with a view to draw up a formal plan for this land. Input will be required from councillors. It was agreed that this project will have to be undertaken in small sections over a period of time.
