CHAIRMAN'S REPORT January 2025

It is the start of another year, and I hope that any resolutions you have made have survived the first three weeks and are now established in whatever habits you felt you needed that will help take you towards your goals for the year.

The Parish Council expects to make further progress this year with the community garden area at Martins Road Fields by starting tree planting. This is expected to be a multi-year project to control the rate of spend, and it is hoped that we will be able to secure grant funding for the majority if not all the cost. To continue to provide essential services to the village, at our January meeting we agreed to set the Parish Precept fee for 2025/6 at £3.20 per month for a Band D property.

The proposed distribution development at Ryehill Farm sits beyond the Parish boundary at Ulceby Skitter. Despite it being beyond the boundary, the Parish Council saw that Ulceby was the community most likely to be affected and had raised objections about the potential impact on the village. Unfortunately, the planning application was approved by North Lincolnshire council. Although the 7.5 Tonne weight limit through the village is expected to be preserved, we will have to wait and see what if any impact the development and movement of vehicles has upon the village and its residents.





Residents should have received a notification letter from National Highways about the extensive roadworks being undertaken on the A180. The diversion plans should minimise the consequences of traffic through the village, although people travelling along that stretch of the A180 during the resurfacing can expect considerable delays (as I have already found).

Just when we thought that we had escaped the worst of the extreme weather events that have severely affected other parts of the country. today we are hit with the winds of storm Eowyn. Given that our village is believed to have been a Viking settlement, I think that there is much to be learnt from the Danish concept of hygge (pronounced "hue-gah"). The literal translation of the word is "cozy", but really means a state of feeling safe and secure by taking time away from the daily rush to enjoy life's quieter pleasures and connect with people you care about or even by yourself. It is characterised by soft furnishings, hearty food, drinking hot chocolate and stopping in, which looks to be the best bet right now. I hope that you too can see yourself safely through the storm.

IN NEED OF URGENT MEDICAL ADVICE?

The NHS 24 111 service provides urgent health advice out of hours. when your GP practice or dentist is closed.

It's sometimes referred to as 'unscheduled care services'. This means that the service is there for you, in the out of hours period when other sources of support such as your doctor or dentist are closed. You should only phone 111 if you're too ill to wait until your GP practice reopens.

Medical emergencies

If you think that someone's life is at risk you should phone 999 immediately. The 111 service isn't suitable for medical emergencies.

On the phone, they may instruct you to perform CPR, and/or get a defibrillator.

DEFIBRILLATORS AND HOW TO USE THEM

There are 2 community defibrillators in Ulceby - one at Ulceby Village Hall, located on the front wall at the right-hand end, and one at Ulceby St Nicholas School, Church Lane. After a cardiac arrest every minute without CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and defibrillation reduces someone's chance of survival by 10 per cent.

Defibrillators are very easy to use. If you come across someone who is not breathing or breathing erratically, the most important thing is to call 999 and start CPR. If you're on your own, don't interrupt the CPR to go and get a defibrillator. find someone else to get it.

When they are at the unit, follow the instructions on it-dial 999, give the number on the unit, and they will be given a code to be able to open the unit and get the defibrillator out, and take it to where it is required. Then all you have to do is follow the spoken instructions given by the machine. You don't need training to use one.

Once in position, the defibrillator detects the heart's rhythm. It won't deliver a shock unless one is needed. They are simple and safe.




Ulceby Village Association is a registered charity, which manages the Village Hall and Playing Field for use by the residents and a number of voluntary groups.
