

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT May 2025

First of all, thank you to all of those who give up their time to engage in voluntary activities to support the village community in any way. We can always think of excuses and reasons why we cannot do something, but only one reason that we can and that is that we believe it is the best use of our time at that moment.

Although there may be one or two exceptions, the volunteers are people who have lived in Ulceby for a long time. I hope that as the village population continues to grow, those who have moved into the village in recent years will be encouraged to come forward and volunteer for activities both to help them feel part of the community and to improve the number and level of things that can be done.

There have been several developments in and around the village either put forward for planning approval in the last 12 months or that are now in the construction phase. These include a major housing development between Ulceby and Ulceby Skitter, a road haulage development beyond the Parish boundary, to the east of the rail station, and a proposed solar farm energy storage installation to the north of the village. It will be interesting to monitor and evaluate the impact these have on the village both during construction and subsequently following completion.

### COMMUNITY GARDEN UPDATE

The Parish Council have been working for some time on leasing the field that sits behind Station Road and accessed from Martins Road. from North Lincolnshire Council. The field has been prone to flooding into properties on Station Road and also attracting fly tipping. The plan being to turn the field into a community asset for residents and nature and prevent flooding through planting.

A small group of residents and Parish Councillors have formed an action group to progress the project and we have made significant progress after the long period of waiting for the legal processes. There are now well over 200 tree saplings of mixed varieties planted as a result of our partnership with Humber Forests and a generous grant from Singleton Birch, including mixed fruit trees. We are now turning our attention the rest of the plan for the field which includes a wild flower and herb garden, hedging, further trees, a seating area and allotments subject to demand.



It was a joy to go to the presentation evening and receive the village plaques celebrating these successes.
