

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT August 2025

I hope that you are all enjoying Summer so far.

It has been good to witness the progress made on the community garden project. In addition to the substantial number of trees planted already this year, people have been coming forward to volunteer their help, offer plants from their gardens, and donated towards funding the work involved. Inevitably, work is seasonal and much of the planting still cannot be completed until later this year, so it will be some time yet before the benefits can be experienced.

Although much of the village is clean and tidy, litter continues to be a problem in a small number of locations. We are grateful to the people who collect and bag litter, often in the early morning. With the increasing village population, we have requested that North Lincolnshire Council review- and hopefully increase- the number of litter bins in key locations. It has also been brought to our attention that the layby on the B1211 at the west end of the village is frequently littered by drivers using it for overnight stopovers. There are no other similar laybys in the surrounding area and considering the 7.5 Tonne weight limit through the village we have requested that it is removed as a layby to eliminate the problem.

The planning application for the Battery Storage facility to the north of the village has been submitted. Although the specialist assessments required have been completed and approved by






regulatory authorities, the Parish Council has raised an objection to the application regarding the proposed Traffic Management Plan since it would impose parking restrictions along Carr Road in Ulceby Skitter for an extended period, but offers no alternative parking arrangements and could cause great difficulty for those with limited mobility.

There are many people in the village who are impacted by the closure announcements of Greenergy and Prax. At the time of writing, the way forward is uncertain. We hope that resolutions will be arrived at, or suitable alternative employment opportunities created in the immediate area that with replace those lost.





WHERE DOES YOUR MONEY GO?

Of the amount each household pays to North Lincolnshire Council in Council Tax, a proportion is passed to Ulceby Parish Council in the precept. Some of this is spent on essential items, and the remainder is spent locally to benefit the village, as the Parish Council thinks fit. Some is used to improve the appearance of the village, such as flower displays and grass cutting around the church and playing field, and some to support local groups and organisations, and recently towards the development of the community garden. If you are involved in such a group which is in need of funding, or are interested in setting up a new group and would like to apply for some financial assistance, please contact Karen Pickering, the Clerk to the Council (details on back page).

The precept was set at £22,000 for 2024/25, but has been increased to £24,000 for the current year 2025/26. Considering the increase in the number of properties in the village, this amounts to very little per household, and the Parish Precept is now £3.20 per month for a Band D property. For your information, the chart below gives a breakdown of how the precept was spent in 2024/25. As well as the precept, payments were received from North Lincolnshire Council for the costs of grass mowing around the village of £4,732, and £800 from the Parochial Church Council towards cutting the grass around the church. In addition, some income is received from the cost of advertising in this newsletter, to cover the cost of its printing.



Further to the last update in the link regarding the field that sits behind Station Road and accessed from Martins Road; progress continues at pace!

The Team working on the establishment of the Community Garden have made a further successful application for 270 saplings from the Woodland Trust which will be planted in the Autumn and also established an agreement with Community Payback who will undertake routine maintenance and fill in the holes that have been created by young people before we started the project (so no blame intended).
