

A meeting of Ulceby Parish Council was held on 19th January 2026 at 7.00pm in the village hall.

PUBLIC FORUM

1. **Apologies for absence:** C Rowland Cllr P Clark and Cllr R Hannigan.

2. **Declaration of Interest on any Agenda Items** – No matters to declare.

3. **Adoption of the minutes of the Monthly Parish Council meeting held on 17th November 2025**

IT WAS RESOLVED that the minutes of the monthly parish council meeting held on 17th November 2025 be confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

4. **Clerks Updates:**

- UKSPF grant – UKSPF has advised that they have allocated their funding and asked that a community pot grant application be submitted for the picnic tables, seats and gates. The clerk has completed this grant application, submitted it and awaiting response from the N.L.C grants team.
- Public Footpath sign near school – This sign has been re-erected.
- Police and Crime Commissioners grant for ANPR(auto speed watch) camera – The email from Neil Thomas (N.L.C) was discussed and noted that N.L.C want to remove the SID (radar activated speed sign) on Spruce lane as it has been in place for a considerable period of time and it doesn't meet the criteria in that it sits at 222 in the strategy and therefore this location does not qualify for a SID as N.L.C only deploys SIDs to those locations sitting in the top 120. N.L.C have said that they will leave the SID on Station Road – it sits at number 42 in the strategy – these SIDs should be rotated on a 3 month rotation – the SID on Station Road has been in place for 4 years due to concerns raised locally. The intention is to remove the SID on Spruce lane – leave the post which should be adopted by the parish council and can then be used for the ANPR sign which is being allocated through the Police and Crime Commissioners funding. The meeting agreed to adopt this post. URSG would prefer the ANPR sign to be situated on the opposite side of the road to the current SID on Spruce lane – using a new post and the post on Spruce Lane, which the parish council will adopt – could be used to rotate the SID on Brocklesby Road which the parish council owns. The parish council was in agreement with the suggestion from URSG and agreed that URSG would discuss this with N.L.C (Neil Thomas) and hopefully come to an amicable agreement regarding these signs and posts. It was noted that the SID sign is needed to compliment the ANPR sign. The grant application for the ANPR has been submitted to The Police and Crime Commissioners grant funding scheme and hopefully the result of this grant application will be known in due course. The meeting agreed that the clerk should ask N.L.C to lay 'golden rivers' on Spruce lane(outside the village hall) to provide recent traffic data for this road.

5. **Planning Applications** - Opportunity for one person from each side (members of the public to state within three minutes objections/support of contested applications).

- a) PA/2025/1479 – Application for lawful development certificate for the existing use of the site as a commercial livery – Meadow Croft Farm, Carr Road, Ulceby.

IT WAS RESOLVED to report NO OBJECTIONS OR COMMENTS.

- b) PA/2025/1601 – Planning permission to vary condition 2 and 7 of PA/2024/10 dated 29/2/24 namely to increase the overall ground/ridge and eaves at height – Hacienda Range, Coronation Road, Ulceby.

IT WAS RESOLVED to report NO OBJECTIONS OR COMMENTS.

- c) Application PA/2025/932 – Planning permission for change of use of an agricultural shed to B1 and B2 use including external alterations for new access doors and erection of detached welfare unit – Grange farm, Croxton.

IT WAS RESOLVED to OBJECT to this planning application as no traffic management plan has been submitted to advise how the weight limit, in which Grange Farm is situated, will be adhered to.

- c) To receive and consider the tender from Barton Mowing Services for the 2026 season.
IT WAS RESOLVED unanimously to accept the tender from Barton Mowing Services for the 2026/7 mowing season.
- d) To consider and set the precept for 2026/7
The Chairman and clerk provided a forward budget for councillors to consider. The budget for the 2026/7 financial year was agreed and **IT WAS RESOLVED** unanimously to set a precept of £28,000 for the financial year 2026/7.

7. Police Matters :

- a) NATS meeting –The next NATS meeting is scheduled for 11th February 2026 at 5.30pm in The Vickers Rooms, Barrow Upon Humber. Cllr Caygill-Ogden was asked to take to this meeting concerns regarding children riding scooter and push bikes, wearing dark clothing along the roads and they are not visible to car drivers.
- b) New Police matters to report – Concern was expressed regarding the speed of vehicles travelling along Carr Road. This is a single track road with limited passing places. The clerk was asked to enquire if ‘golden rivers’ can be laid to monitor speed of vehicles along this road.
It was noted that there appears to be a sign- stating no parking and camera in the lay-by opposite Abdals restaurant – the meeting questioned who instigated this camera and what is it monitoring.

8. North Lincolnshire Council Matters:

- a) Reports from N.L.C representatives: Cllr Wells will speak to Cllr Hannigan regarding the planning application at Grange farm, Wootton.
- b) Community Speed Watch – URSG representative advised that traffic is still exceeding the speed limit along Spruce lane and Brocklesby Road. Cllr Wells advised that N.L.C use/take notice of data derived from ‘golden rivers’ and the parish council should request ‘golden rivers’ along Spruce lane.
- c) Road Safety : No new matters to report.
- d) New matters to report: Due to the College Road, East Halton road closure, the roads through Ulceby are being used more and are deteriorating – clerk to ask N.L.C to inspect and instigate any necessary repairs.
Pots holes are evident and need repair on Abbey Road, West End Road – near the Wootton Road junction, Martins Road and Carr lane.

All work, for the time being, has now been completed – awaiting response to the grant application for the picnic benches and seats and gates.
- b) New village matters:
 - i) New village matters – The Link magazine will shortly be available for distribution. It was suggested that Abdals be approached for a donation towards the community garden or towards the senior citizens Christmas party.
