CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

February 2026

I hope you enjoyed a peaceful Christmas and New Year. My sincere thanks go to everyone who continued providing essential services over the holiday period, supporting both our community and the wider region.

Since the last issue, excellent progress has been made on the community garden project. The planting phase is now complete, with more than five hundred trees and around two and a half thousand bulbs planted by a dedicated group of volunteers. Bulbs have also been added to the grass verges at the village entry points, which will brighten our surroundings as spring approaches.

A section of the garden has been designated as a community orchard, where newly planted fruit trees will eventually provide harvests for everyone to enjoy. The wider garden includes a picnic area and children's play space, and applications have been submitted for additional bench seating. The field remains open for dog walkers, but I kindly remind all owners to keep the area clean and to pick up after their pets so the space remains safe for all users.

There have also been important developments regarding the future of the Prax Lindsey Oil Refinery. Phillips 66, the neighbouring company, has confirmed its purchase of the site. While integration into their operations is underway, there are currently no plans to restart standalone refinery activity. According to the official receiver's December statement, the remaining 250

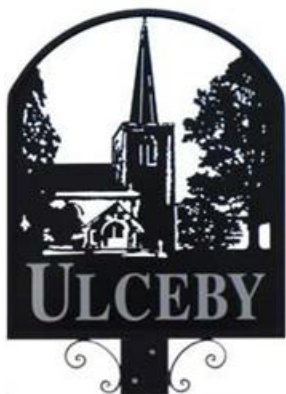
employees—following the redundancy of 125 workers in October—are guaranteed employment until the end of March. Understandably, the longer-term uncertainty continues to affect local families, and I sincerely hope that meaningful employment opportunities will remain available in our area.

The Government has been urged to select the Humber as the location for the UK's first hydrogen infrastructure network and to accelerate carbon capture and storage initiatives. These decisions could make 2026 a pivotal year for the region's energy sector and help create new employment pathways.

The Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ) is expected to begin a competitive process in the first half of 2026 to select one industrial region to receive £500 million of investment. This funding would support the development of the UK's first regional hydrogen transport and storage network, linking hydrogen producers with major users such as power stations and industrial sites. The Humber is widely regarded as a strong contender, with the potential to generate thousands of skilled jobs and significant supply-chain opportunities.

As we look ahead to spring—with longer days, brighter weather, and the first signs of growth—I hope you enjoy watching the community garden come to life.

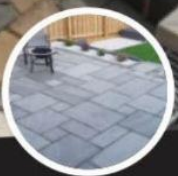

As we move into the new year there is mixed news on our Village Community Garden! The garden is starting flourish, with spring bulbs starting to emerge and also some of the plants are starting to grow from the seeds as well.

We had an issue with the less sturdy canes and protectors and some stakes blowing over in the high wind, and it was clear we were going to need more stakes to replace the canes. Volunteers have completed this work as well as planting a few more trees, including a walnut tree. Sadly, this was left to few of the volunteer team as not all the regulars could make it. However, they were supported by 2 new volunteers. Thank you, Simon and Becky - you did great, making the job much lighter for the more mature of us

We are still awaiting the outcome of an application for funding for the benches and picnic tables.

The really disappointing news probably won't be a surprise to many; is the field is heavily polluted with dog faeces (poo!). This really saddens the volunteers who have put so much effort into creating a nice environment for villagers to visit, including with dogs, but feel we have been disrespected in our efforts, by what I am sure are the minority of residents with dogs.

Speaking as a dog owner, and my dog has 'volunteered' along with me in helping to create the garden and wildlife area, I am deeply disappointed. Please do the responsible thing and pickup! Use the bins nearby or take it home, don't throw the bag in the hedge. This simple courtesy will allow the whole community, including children, to use the space in the spring and summer. Transforming Ulceby: Significant Donation Supports School's Vision for Excellence



A make-over of a North Lincolnshire village school's provision for the youngest pupils is set to take place in the New Year after Ulceby St Nicholas Church of England Primary School received a gift worth over £15,500 to overhaul the provision for its youngest pupils, making it more vibrant, welcoming and engaging for the young learners.

“Our early years provision was looking a little dated, and we had identified clear areas for development to support our youngest pupils and most vulnerable children, including those with special educational needs and disabilities, but as always, stretching school funds to meet this whilst retaining a strong staff team was proving challenging,” comments interim head teacher, Andrea Commins. “We had a ‘wish list’ of resources and furniture for the space, and were looking at ways we might be able to raise funds to support this crucial part of early years education.

Help came through a charity established in 1722, which saw money and land bequeathed by local resident Thomas Richardson to support the education of the poor in the village. Originally called The Charity of Thomas Richardson, it became The Ulceby School Endowment Trust in 1930 when it was formally registered.

“We know there is often a gap between the funding available to schools from government budgets and what they need to provide the best possible education to children in the village, and this fund helps by providing additional resources and enrichment for the pupils,” comments Barrie Jeffery, Chair of the Trust. “We were delighted to receive a proposal for resources that would completely upgrade the children’s facilities, and look forward to seeing the results in the Spring.”

The resources include a books and puppets area, role playing resources, shelving and storage that is accessible to the children, to help support their growth, development and independence.

“We were expecting the Trust to pick a few items from our wish list and were absolutely bowled over when they offered to fund all of the items,” adds Andrea. “This will make a truly transformational difference to our Early Years Foundation Stage provision – a brilliant way for any child to start their time at school!”

DIAL 159 TO STOP FRAUD

Sometimes you might get a phone call or text from a scammer who's actually impersonating your bank or other institution. They might even have some of your personal data and may sound genuine. The scammer may try to rush you into transferring money into a so-called "safe account", or they might pretend that a police officer or "banking official" must collect cash from you in person immediately.

It's rare but it happens. Scammers can be extremely manipulative, and will try to defraud victims without a second thought. Don't ever rely on your phone's caller display screen to show a genuine number, as numbers can be falsified.

The advice is always, if you're in doubt, just hang up. If you're worried, then dial 159. This connects you directly to your bank's anti-fraud department where you'll find more help and support. Just dial **159** and simply say which bank you're with, and **159** will connect you directly to your own bank's anti-fraud department.

159 is a trusted number, which works with most major UK banks and mobiles/landlines (including Internetty landlines when I tested it). Spread the word! You can learn more about **159** at <https://stopscamsuk.org.uk/campaign/get-help-now/>

- **From April**, the new burgundy bin will be used for all dry recycling

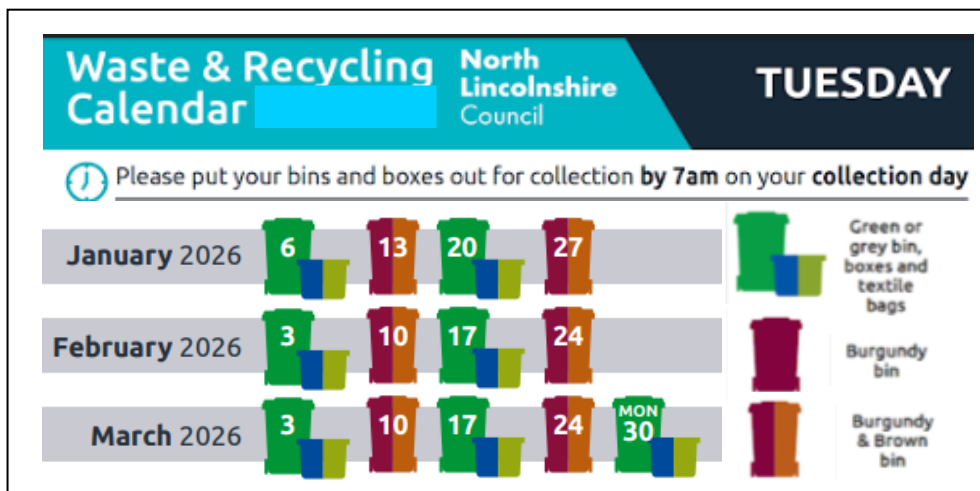
