2. **Declaration of Interest on any Agenda Items** – No matters to declare.

3. **Adoption of the minutes of the Monthly Parish Council meeting held on 16th March 2026**

IT WAS RESOLVED that the minutes of the monthly parish council meeting held on 16th March 2026 be confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

4. **Clerks Updates:**

- N.L.C Community Pot grant for benches and picnic tables at the community garden – a grant of £2113 has been awarded. Clerk and Cllr Hulatt to liaise to order the furniture for the garden area.
- Police and Crime Commissioners grant for ANPR(auto speed watch) camera – this grant has been awarded – the equipment has been ordered and paid for and the invoice will be sent to the Police and crime Commissioners office for the 50% grant to be provided to the parish council.
- Pot Holes : Abbey Road, Carr Road, Martins Road and outside Worsley Paddock – all reported to N.L.C. Cllr Hannigan will ask for repairs at Hallcroft to be undertaken in August during the school holidays.

7. Police Matters :

- a) NATS meeting – No report to receive, the next meeting is to be held during the first week of May.
- b) New Police matters to report – There has been a break in and arson at a property on Abbey Road. Inconsiderate parking is occurring at the corner of Abbey Road and Spruce lane, the traffic warden has visited the village and issued parking tickets. Cllr Wells will ask how many visits to the village have taken place and how many tickets have been issued in Ulceby.

8. North Lincolnshire Council Matters:

- a) Reports from N.L.C representatives: Cllr Hannigan advised that the In Bloom grants will be available this year and the clerk confirmed that an application has been made. Cllr Hannigan advised that the old smaller burgandy bins will be collected, they are to be left close to the road side, visible for collection. Unfortunately the assisted bin collection system has been problematic but N.L.C are working to improve the system.
- b) Community Speed Watch – It was reported that the Community Speed watch team do work in the village most weeks.
- c) Road Safety : It was reported that there is a possibility that the A180 will be resurfaced which has raised concerns that the village may suffer from the diverted traffic whilst the work is taking place. There is also going to be overnight closures on the A160 although the diversion is not anticipated to be through Ulceby. A discussion took place regarding the possibility of having speed camera warning signs – these signs are normally only allowable if there is a registered place where the speed camera van is situated. The question was raised to who allocates these signs and who stipulates who can have these signs.
- d) New matters to report: No new matters to report.

- Email from PCC advising the parish council that they no longer require the services of Barton Mowing Services for the churchyard mowing. The clerk explained that a contract had been signed with B.M.S to have their mowing services for the year. The meeting felt that the PCC should provide their contribution for the mowing season 2026.

10. Environmental and Village issues

- a) Station Road – land for community garden:
 - i) Update on progress made – Cllr Hulatt advised that the daffodil bulbs have flowered along with other wild flower seeds, but no bluebells are evident as yet. The community payback team have been thanked for their work and photographs sent. The grass does need cutting again – clerk to ask B.M.S if they would like to undertake this work (compensation for losing the church mowing) – if this field isn't suitable for the mowers, J Nettleton will be asked.
- b) New village matters:
 - i) New village matters – The hedge outside Advent Court needs cutting back and the vacancy on the parish council can now be advertised.
