3. **Adoption of the minutes of the Annual Council and Monthly Parish Council meeting held on 19<sup>th</sup> May 2026**

**7. Police Matters :**

- a) NATS meeting – HGV’s travelling through the village – ignoring the weight limit – were reported and a request for more enforcement was made. The next NATS meeting is scheduled for 29<sup>th</sup> July at 6pm.
- b) New Police matters to report – No new Police matters to report.

**8. North Lincolnshire Council Matters:**

- a) Reports from N.L.C representatives: Cllr Wells advised that some road resurfacing will take place in the area – namely Wootton, Thornton Curtis and Kirmington. The clerk will reiterate to N.L.C that Hallcroft needs resurfacing work during the school holidays.
- b) Community Speed Watch – High speeds of 88mph have been recorded on Brocklesby Road and 80mph on Spruce lane. Unfortunately the community speed watch team continue to receive abuse from motorists and the team feel that further Police support is required.
- c) Road Safety :
  - i) Purchase of SID for Spruce lane – The clerk reported that the application to the community pot fund has been submitted – not heard back from N.L.C as yet. The new post for the ANPR sign to be situated outside Fairville, Spruce Lane has been fitted and the ANPR sign will be erected shortly.
- d) New matters to report: No new matters to report.

**10. Environmental and Village issues**

- a) Station Road – land for community garden: The benches, picnic tables and ‘kissing’ gate have all been delivered and awaiting installation. The memorial bench will now be fitted with the other benches by Ulceby PC. Humber Forest have revisited the site and have marked up where replacement trees need planting. Community pay-back have agreed to return to the community garden and mow/trim and rake the grass off the areas between the flower meadows. Some wild flowers have grown and hopefully more will appear as the season progresses. There is some fly-tipping in the corner of the field which will need removing – it has been there for some considerable time – not a recent ‘crime’.
- b) New village matters: Cllr Caygill-Ogden advised that URSG have been campaigning for horse rider signs in the village. N.L.C have not been too receptive to such signs and the parish council agreed that they were supportive of URSG in their campaign to achieve these signs for the village. It was reported that residents of Stephens Close – who have limited parking close to their properties, experience difficulties when work men are undertaking work to properties in the Close – in that there is no where for such work vans to park. A discussion took place regarding the possibility of parking in the lay-by on Spruce Lane (it has been noted that this lay-by sometimes has vehicles parked in it overnight and for long periods of time – curtailing the opportunity for workman visiting Stephens Close to use this lay-by facility). The parish council felt that it would be very difficult to ‘Police’ parking in this lay-by. A number of hedges in the village have grown rapidly and are now encroaching the pavements making it difficult for pedestrians. It was noted that the underpass near the quarry is flooded again – Cllr Rowland has reported this to N.L.C who have indicated that they will arrange a site meeting to investigate.
