CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

May 2026

The April Parish Council meeting also included the Annual Assembly, which is a review of the activities over the last year. This report provides an overview of key developments, ongoing issues, and areas of progress, reflecting both the work of the Parish Council and the contributions of residents and partner organisations.

The most visible activity has been the continued focus on local infrastructure and public spaces. Several residents have raised concerns about road safety, particularly around high traffic points at the cross-roads. These concerns remain a priority, and the Council has continued to press for appropriate measures from the relevant authorities. While progress can be slow, the persistence of residents and councillors alike ensures the issue remains firmly on the agenda.

We are already seeing some of the benefits from the efforts of those who worked on the community garden project. as Spring flowers bloom and the wildflowers start to populate the areas where they were sown. It will take some years though before the trees have matured enough to bear fruit.

Litterpicking by a small number of individual residents has helped keep the village tidy, and their work is appreciated. Seasonal planting and upkeep of green spaces have added welcome colour and character, reinforcing the pride some take in the appearance of the village.

The Village Hall has seen regular use, offering opportunities for social connection and shared purpose. These gatherings play an important role in maintaining the cohesion of the village, particularly for those who may otherwise feel isolated. The Council extends its thanks to the volunteers and committees who give their time to organise and run these activities.

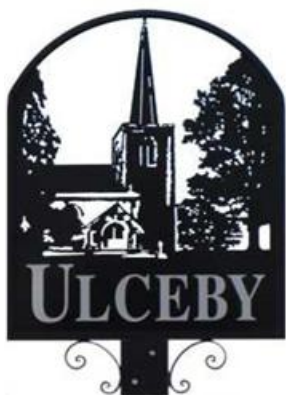
Planning matters have also featured prominently. A number of applications were reviewed, and the Council submitted comments where appropriate, ensuring that the interests of the village are represented. As always, the Council's role is advisory, but we continue to advocate for development that respects the character of the village. Residents are encouraged to remain engaged with planning consultations, as community input strengthens the decision-making process.

The Parish Council has also continued its work on governance, finance, and compliance. Routine reviews of policies, budgets, and procedures have been undertaken to ensure transparency and accountability. The precept has been managed carefully, with attention to both current needs and long-term responsibilities. The Council remains committed to prudent financial stewardship and to communicating clearly with residents about how funds are used.

Finally, I want to acknowledge the constructive tone maintained in most parish correspondence and interactions. Where issues have arisen, they have been handled through the proper channels, reinforcing the importance of respectful dialogue and due process. This approach allows us to work more effectively on behalf of the community.

As we move into the next quarter, the Council will continue to focus on road safety, village maintenance, community wellbeing, and responsible governance. My thanks go to fellow councillors, volunteers, and residents for their continued commitment.

We are also planning a summer holiday children's club at the church. Dates and times are to be decided, but if that would be of interest let us have your details so we can keep you updated.

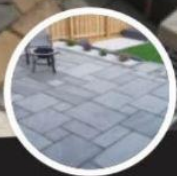

"Take only memories - leave only footprints"

As the weather turns warmer and we all spend more time outdoors, here is a quick reminder of the countryside code to ensure we can all enjoy the open spaces around Ulceby safely and respectfully.

The Countryside Code: Key Rules

- Respect other people using the countryside, including farmers, landowners, and local residents
- Stick to marked paths and public rights of way
- Leave gates and property as you find them (open or closed)
- Keep dogs under control and away from livestock
- Take all litter home—leave no trace of your visit
- Do not light fires or cause damage to the land
- Protect wildlife by not disturbing animals or plants
- Park responsibly without blocking access routes
- Be prepared and stay safe by checking weather and planning ahead
- Follow local signs and any additional guidance in the area

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COMMUNITY GARDEN UPDATE

Spring has sprung well and truly in the Community Garden. The garden is starting flourish, with a good show of spring flowers, which started with snow drops, daffodils, tulips, fritillaries and crocuses, and now bluebells, lady's smock and wild garlic. The tiny tree saplings the volunteers planted are showing signs of life, along with the trees planted by Humber Forest. The fruit trees are also starting to blossom, so fingers crossed we have fruit for villagers this year. Not sure if we have occupants to the bird and owl boxes yet!



Further good news is we have secured funding of £2,113 towards the benches and a gate and fencing.

The field seems much cleaner with regards to dog faeces, so thank you dog walkers please keep it up. There are 2 dog waste bins in the vicinity of the field, 1 on the corner of advent Court, the other on Martin's road. There is also a bin on Station Road. However, we are pursuing enquiries regarding the possibility of a new bin with North

Lincolnshire Council, to be sited on entry into the field as the development may well increase the need for a new bin.

The less positive news is that the children who created bike ramps on the field before its development have now come back and are digging by the path around the field. Sadly, this will represent a hazard to people using the field and cannot continue. Would parents please deter the children from doing this. We are aware they had a previous site destroyed and have empathy with them, but the field has to be safe for all users, including those with disabilities.



ULCEBY POND

Peer into the edges of the pond and you will see an abundance of tadpoles this year. Short fat things that are feeding well. Sadly for them, they are also being fed upon. Our resident carp, although few in number, are making the most of the early evening sunshine and attacking the shallow water with a vengeance. Not to be outdone the perch are also on the prowl, given away by the silver fish flashing like underwater fireworks as they are hunted. The tench and crucian carp are rooting amongst the reeds - if you watch carefully, you will see the stems twitching as they are dug into. This is also done by the roach that have finished spawning and are cleaning themselves in the flora. Soon it will be the turn of the bream, who will use the same areas, meaning we will see cross contamination and roach/bream hybrids will be born, all silver humped in body with striking red fins. The resident ide(orfe) and chub are also active taking flies, bugs and anything they can get in their huge mouths. If you are really lucky you may see the orange back of one of two resident goldfish, or the flash of blue from the tiny gudgeon.

Interestingly I see lots more observation from our younger anglers rather than the running around of the past. They are seeing the rewards too, with their catch rates going up. I watched one young man lay a tench in his net to rest it before gently returning it back. I feel the pond is in safe hands at present with our younger generation. Maybe, just maybe the Saturday morning coaching is working – back for the summer on alternate Saturday mornings.

The funds have been raised for new fishing stations. I hope some of you could give up some time to help install them. Patrick will set a date. In the meantime, enjoy our oasis of tranquillity, we are so lucky.

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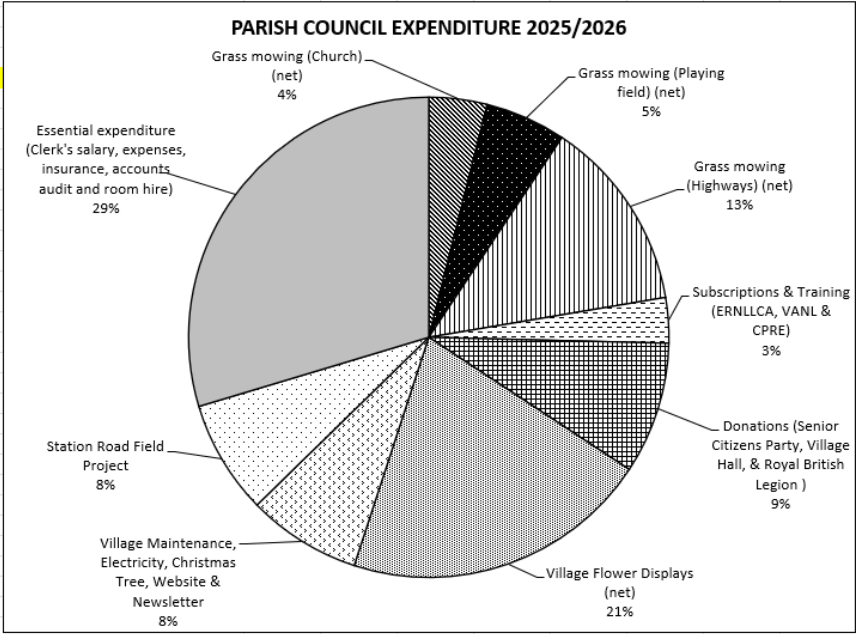
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WHERE DOES YOUR MONEY GO?

Of the amount each household pays to North Lincolnshire Council in Council Tax, a proportion is passed to Ulceby Parish Council in the precept. Some of this is spent on essential items, and the remainder is spent locally to benefit the village, as the Parish Council thinks fit. Some is used to improve the appearance of the village, such as flower displays and grass cutting around the church and playing field, and some to support local groups and organisations, and recently towards the development of the community garden. If you are involved in such a group which is in need of funding, or are interested in setting up a new group and would like to apply for some financial assistance, please contact Karen Pickering, the Clerk to the Council (details on back page).

The precept was set at £24,000 for 2025/26, but has been increased to £28,000 for the current year 2026/27. This amounts to very little per household, and the Parish Precept is now £3.73 per month for a Band D property. For your information, the chart below gives a breakdown of how the precept was spent in 2025/26. As well as the precept, payments were received from North Lincolnshire Council for the costs of grass mowing around the village of £4,732, and £800 from the Parochial Church Council towards cutting the grass around the church. In addition, some income is received from the cost of advertising in this newsletter, to cover the cost of its printing.



BIN COLLECTIONS

BURGUNDY BINS – Most of the new larger burgundy bins have been delivered. If you haven’t received yours yet, contact North Lincolnshire Council.

 They will be collecting remaining old recycling bins as they push through the final phase of the rollout. They’ve now delivered over 70,000 new burgundy bins and collected more than 55,000 old ones. If you still have an old bin, please leave it out and accessible and they will get it collected.
