PUBLIC FORUM

The clerk reported that the resignation of Dawn Macefield has been received due to her moving from the area.

2.**Declaration of Interest on any Agenda Items** – No matters to declare.

3.**Adoption of the minutes of the Monthly Parish Council meeting held on 15th June 2026**

IT WAS RESOLVED that the minutes of the annual council and monthly parish council meeting held on 15th June 2026 be confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

4. **Clerks Updates:**

- Police and Crime Commissioners grant for ANPR(auto speed watch) camera – this grant has been awarded and a final claim form can now be submitted.
- 'A' Signs at the cross roads – the enforcement officer has been notified, will inspect and report his/her findings to the parish council in due course.

5. **Planning Applications** - Opportunity for one person from each side (members of the public to state within three minutes objections/support of contested applications).

No planning applications received.

The clerk advised that approximately £54,000 S106 money will be available for recreational play facilities from the Station Road development – once the first property is occupied. The parish council is not able to provide funding towards improvements the school.

7. Police Matters :

- a) NATS meeting –The next NATS meeting is scheduled for 29th July at 6pm.
- b) New Police matters to report – It was reported that youths are trying doors of properties at night - Cllr Waltham advised that N.L.C were bring out a stronger communities campaign which is likely to be launched in September/October. A discussion took place regarding a neighbourhood watch scheme – there is one in Ulceby – Cllr Waltham advised that N.L.C will provide help and advise to promote this scheme.

8. North Lincolnshire Council Matters:

- a) Reports from N.L.C representatives: Cllr Waltham advised that free swimming will be made available to all school children through the summer holidays and that The Government has agreed to allow North Lincolnshire Council to remain – not having to join with other Lincolnshire authorities.
- b) Community Speed Watch – URSG representatives advised the meeting that a number of vehicles have been recorded by the ANPR camera regularly exceeding the speed limit. The number plates of these vehicles will be sent through to Humberside Police who will contact the offenders. The ANPR camera and the SID are working well together, this allows data comparison.
- c) Road Safety :
 - i) Purchase of SID for Spruce lane – The clerk reported that N.L.C have provided £2,419.00 from the community pot fund towards the purchase of a SID for Spruce Lane – to replace the N.L.C owned SID. Clerk to liaise with URSG to order this sign.
Cllr Waltham kindly provided 6 ‘Horse Rider’ safety signs which URSG representatives will erect in suitable places in the village.
URSG representatives expressed concern regarding the recent planning approval for the Solar battery farm situated along Carr Road. The developer wishes to access the site off Station Road and this will result in a loss of resident car parking spaces along Carr Road during the construction period. Cllr Waltham and URSG representatives are arranging a site meeting with the developers (LightRock) to discuss the traffic concerns and problems which will arise if the access to this site is to be from Station Road. Cllr Waltham reassured the meeting that N.L.C Highways will not sign off the permissions until an acceptable traffic management plan is in place.
- d) New matters to report: No new matters to report.

10. Environmental and Village issues

- a) Station Road – land for community garden: The benches, picnic tables and ‘kissing’ gate have all been delivered and installation is imminent. The Community Payback scheme have returned to the filed to undertake some strimming.
- b) Parish Pump Area – IT WAS RESOLVED to ask J Nettleton to undertake a tidy up of this area – cut back the hedges behind the pump and to the rear of the area, prune all shrubs and a general tidy of the area. It was agreed to set a maximum budget of £500 for this work.
- c) New village matters: Cllr Burdin advised that the plaque behind the War Memorial needs attention (re-fixing) – Cllr Berney agreed to take a look and see if he could resolve the matter.
Cllr Burdin has undertaken a tidy round the village in preparation for the judging of the ‘Best Kept Village’ competition, signs have been cleaned and a litter pick undertaken.
